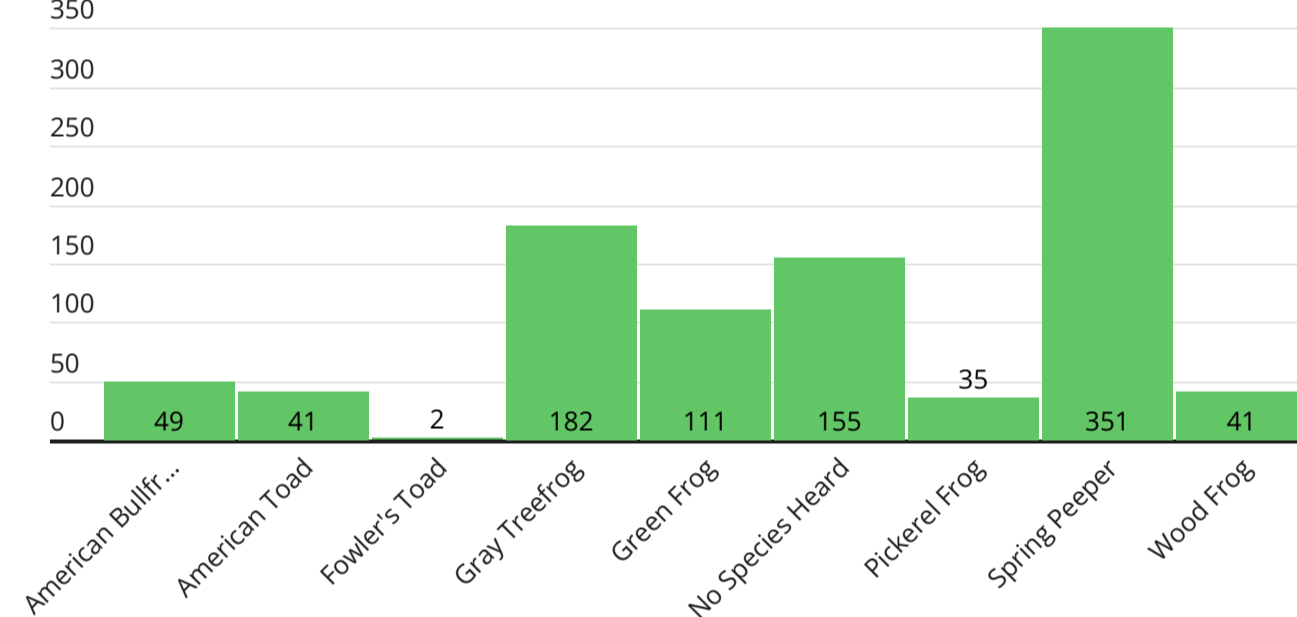

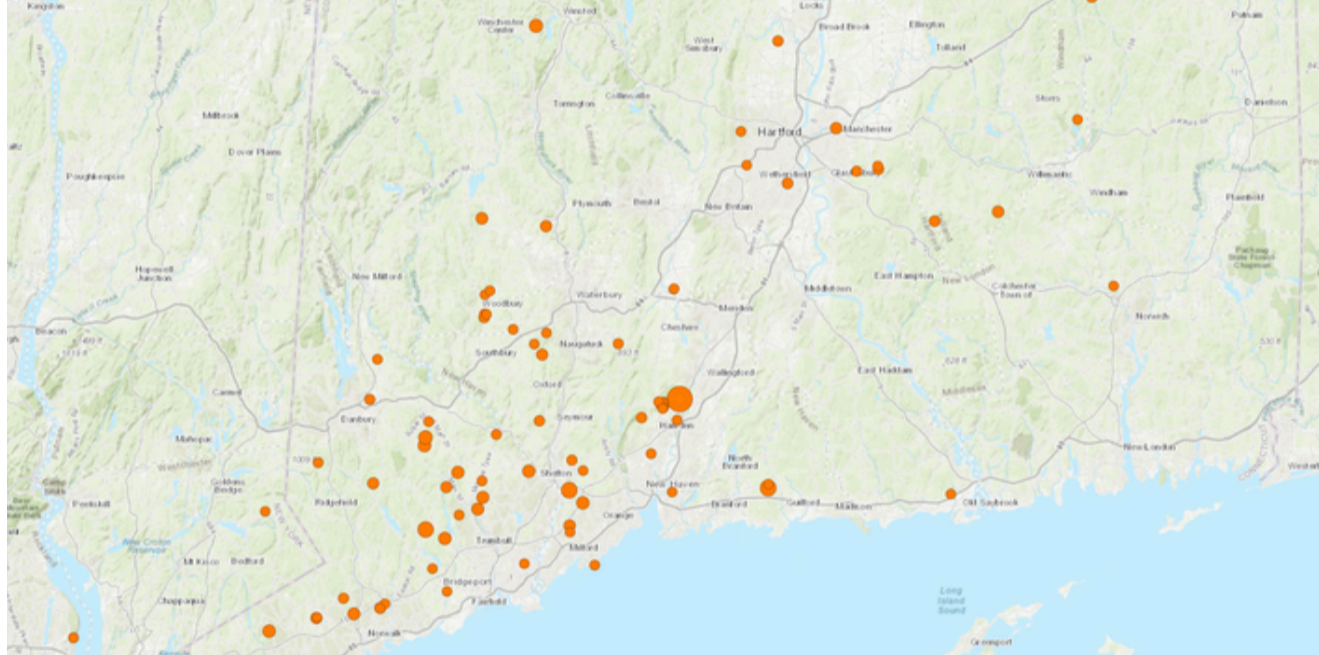


Curious about those late fall calls?

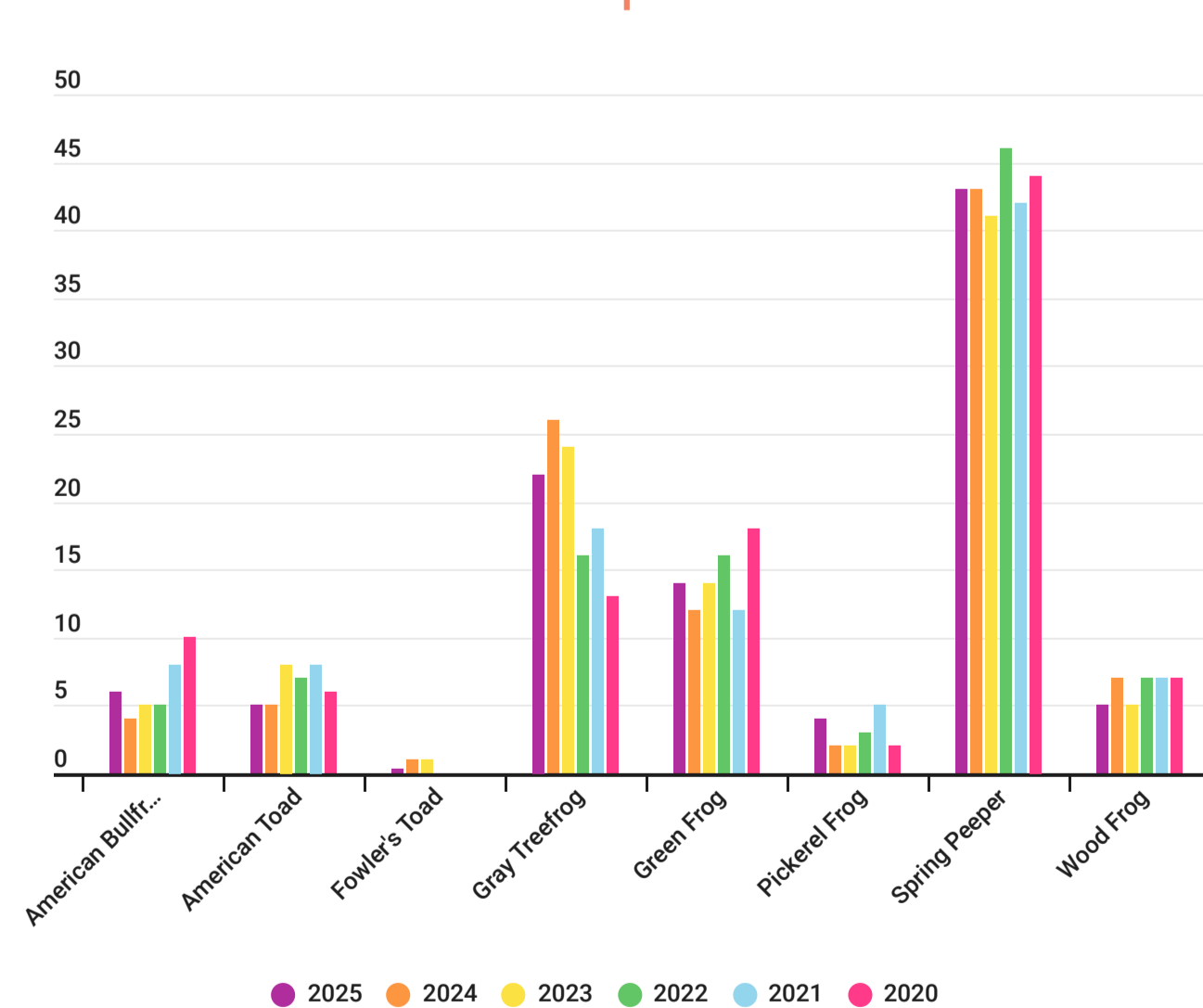

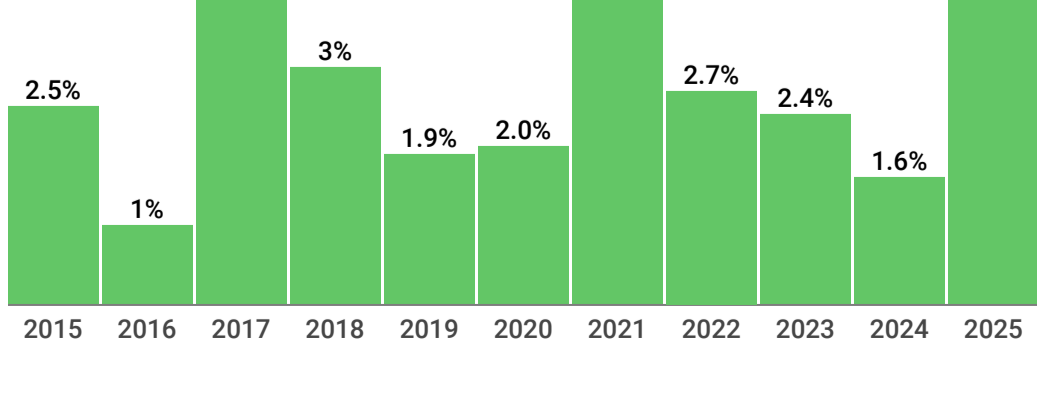

What stood out for me this year was the call of the Pickerel Frog! This is a species I tend to see but not hear, however this year I listened to their snore on multiple occasions!
